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
Change of legislation

New National Restrictions from 5 November

Sadly, no congregational/communal worship is allowed from the 5th November 2020, places of worship are still permitted to open but ONLY for Individual Worship in line with Government Guidelines.

Individual Worship - Guidelines and Information

Members of the community who intend to perform Salaah at Masjid-E Tauheedul Islam are requested to note the following:

Timings for the masjid - For Salaah timings please visit www.masjidetauheedulislam.com

• Open all day – For Individual Worship, no Congregational prayers are permitted.

Can I come to the Masjid?

- Adults Individuals and Elderly with underlying health conditions and anyone with confirmed or suspected Covid-19 symptoms should refrain coming into the Masjid and continue to perform Salaah at home.
- Children Aged 7 or above are welcome to the Masjid, however they must remain accompanied by an adult, this will be kept under constant review.

What do I need to do before coming to the Masjid?

- Wudhu (ablution) must be performed at home prior to attending the Masjid.
- Musallah (prayer mat) You will be required to bring your own Musallah
- Face Covering It is now mandatory to wear face coverings whilst visiting the Masjid, please find more information https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms

What to expect when I arrive at the Masjid?

- Hand sanitizer stations will be in place for all Musallees to apply on entry and exiting of the Masjid.
- Jamat Khana will be used for individual worship, in the case where the Jamaat Khana has reached capacity, please use the first-floor prayer hall using the internal staircase (Bicknell Street side).
- Please adhere to instructions provided whilst at the Masjid and follow signage located around the premises.
- All individual worship will take place with 1 metre plus mitigation social distancing. This will stay under review.

What to do if I am showing symptoms?

- Do not attend and:
 - Get a test to check if you have coronavirus as soon as possible.
 - o Stay at home and do not have visitors until you get your test result only leave your home to have a test.
 - o Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, must also stay at home until you get your result.

Finally, help us by following these protocols.

- Do not attend if you have symptoms
- <u>Do not</u> congregate inside/outside the Masjid
- <u>Do</u> get tested immediately, if you or someone in your household is showing symptoms
- <u>Do</u> wear a face covering
- Do wudhu at home
- <u>Do</u> bring your own Musallah
